





Finalists announced 2016 Grace Cossington Smith art award

Finalist Exhibition 5 November to 10 December 2016 Winner announced at the GCS Gallery 3–5 pm 5 November 2016

The Grace Cossington Smith Gallery and Abbotsleigh are delighted to announce that works by 15 artists have been shortlisted for the acquisitive Grace Cossington Smith art award. The winner will receive \$15,000 and the remaining finalists will receive \$1,000 each.

The selection panel and judges for the 2016 Grace Cossington Smith art award are Rhonda Davis, senior curator at the Macquarie University Art Gallery and Dr. Andrew Frost, a researcher in science fiction, cinema and contemporary art, the art critic for Guardian Australia and a lecturer in the Dept. Media, Music, Communications and Cultural Studies at Macquarie University, Sydney.

Entries were received from around the country from artists who created two dimensional artworks responding to the theme of Making Connections.

The judges acknowledged that creating a shortlist of only 15 finalists from the many submissions made the selection process very difficult. They were impressed by the variety and diversity of the submissions revealing great rigour and quality from artists at differing stages in their career.
